Throughout next week, Year 4 children will sit their statutory times table assessment. The children will be supported by their class teacher and Ms Dougan. The system for assessment is an online assessment and the children have had the opportunity over the past few weeks to have several practice goes. We know they will do their very best. Your child's results will be included as part of their end of year report in July.

Measles Cases Rising: Call For Action

Number of measles cases are rising in the UK with London having highest number of cases in England. Lewisham has the highest number of measles cases in Southeast London.

- Two doses of the MMR vaccine are required to be fully protected against measles.
- More information about the MMR vaccine can be found on the NHS website.
 - The MMR vaccine is a combination vaccine which protects against three diseases – measles, mumps and rubella.
 - In England, children should receive their first dose of the MMR vaccine when they turn 12 months old, the second dose is given when children turn 18 months.
 - It is never too late to get vaccinated. People of any age who have missed MMR vaccinations can have them at their GP practice.
- The MMR vaccine is safe, free, effective and the best protection for our children and young adults.



- measles outbreaks happen when not enough children have been vaccinated
- measles can be a very serious disease, leading to ear and chest infections, fits, diarrhoea, and damage to the brain.
 Measles can kill
- your child is at risk of measles if he or she hasn't had the MMR vaccination
- 2 doses of MMR vaccine are needed to get the best protection
- if your child is due to have had 2 doses of MMR but has not yet received them, no matter what age they are, you should contact your GP to get them vaccinated as soon as possible*
- if you can't remember if your child has had any, 1 or 2 doses of MMR vaccine, check his or her personal child health record (the Red Book). If this doesn't help, speak to your GP
- if you don't know how many doses your child has had, it's better to have 2 doses of MMR vaccine now rather than risk leaving them unprotected

*In response to a local outbreak then the 2 doses can be given one month apart from the age of 18 months.
